In February, the Lakeshore Museum Center community lost a wonderful volunteer, **John Augustin.** We were honored that his friends and family made contributions in his memory to the Muskegon Heritage Museum of Business & Industry.



A few months later, I received an additional surprise. John had left a bequest in his will to the museum.

He made such an impact on those around him that we received numerous donations to the endowment fund for that site, which was a nice way to remember John & the museum he was so fond of. As a new Executive Director, this was my first time experiencing this. I was honored that he would continue his legacy this way. Welcome to the Historic Sites

Many Thanks from the Historic Sites

With so many tours, programs, and events that happen at the Historic Sites, it's no surprise that we rely on our volunteers to provide the best possible experience for our visitors. Although we're only halfway through our open season, the help of our volunteers has already made a huge difference this year. Since May, our Historic Sites volunteers have

already put in 367 hours!

While we have a terrific group of part-time staff, our volunteers help to fill out our day-to-day schedule by taking tours at the Hackley and Hume Houses and welcoming visitors at the Fire Barn Museum and Scolnik House of the Depression Era. In addition to helping with our regular visitors, a

number of our volunteers help

with the Pearl Mist cruise ship excursions and other group tours that visit our Sites. Volunteers help also played a huge role in our Hackley Day Community

Celebration on May 20. Our Site welcomed 168



visitors in a three-hour span, and our Site volunteers, along with the LMC Junior Museum Professionals (JMPs), lent a hand with our walk-through tours, hands-on activities, and crafts. The JMPs and Site volunteers also helped

with our annual Roaring '20s Tea on June 17.

Our volunteers have been hard at work on a database project that is revolutionizing our research about the Hackley and Hume families. Since 2021, our volunteers have entered information from original Hackley and Hume family receipts, which we can then search by date or keyword.

This allows us to do research in just a few seconds that previously would have taken days. So far, this database contains information from 3.322 receipts!

Joining our returning group of thirteen veteran volunteers, we were lucky enough to have three new volunteers join us this year. This season we've welcomed Bill Rafaill, Katherine Jawor, and Olivia Cox to the Historic Sites team.

Junior Museum Professionals

This summer the Lakeshore Museum Center welcomed our eighth cohort of Junior Museum Professionals (JMPs). We have been fortunate to have had 42 students move through the program since it started in 2015. It has been great to get to know the young people in this talented group.





We have now gotten to the point where, some of our first JMPs are actually in college! Our JMP program is designed to give young people a taste of the museum field while also learning skills such as presenting information, working as a team, creating programming, and working with people of all ages.

As a whole, they have brought a wonderful sense of energy and a lot of creativity to the Museum.

This year we have welcomed Elias Sybenga, Penelope Stidham, Rowan VanWoerkom, and Christopher Rash to the team, and we have 15 young people serving this summer.

The big project for the group this year has been to organize a 4th Birthday Party for Moxie the Mastodon in August. This included making an event worksheet, taking a trip to Revel to learn about marketing, and even asking for inkind donations.

We recently created a virtual session on our JMP program for the Midwest Museums Association Conference, and it was really great to look back at how the program has grown and changed. As a part of that session, I reached out to former JMPs to talk about their experience. I will leave you with some thoughts from one of the two alumni from the original group of young people.

"My name is Natalie Horton, and I am now a junior at Michigan State University studying pre-med. I was at the Heritage Park from 2015-2017. One thing I learned while participating in this program was how to better communicate with adults and the public.

I am still to this day thankful for this program teaching me to better communicate and share information with those around me. My favorite part of participating in this program was how much I got to learn about Michigan's history too! I learned something new every day I volunteered!"


Volunteer Highlights


